and is valid for a period of 5 years.

1. About SEVAI

Society for Education, Village Action and Improvement(SEVAI) was founded in 1975, by Dr. K. Govindaraju at Allur Village in Trichy District, Tamilnadu. SEVAI aims to involve itself in activities for the development of the poor and vulnerable in society through education, personality and skill development. It works toward renewal of rural areas, through development of persons within and through a community with a focus on peace, social justice and quality of life. SEVAI also runs educational facilities. It has done enormous projects for sustainable development of slums in key areas such as healthcare, education, creation and maintenance of infrastructure and conservation of environment. Human resources are tapped from local communities and government. It has achieved a lot of success through projects related to watershed management, Inclusive education, shelter constructions, children projects, education, self help groups, health and sanitation, promotion of agriculture & protection of cattle, and disaster management.

2. About Shrimati Indira Gandhi College

Shrimati Indira Gandhi College is a Self-Financing college affiliated to the Bharathidasan University and accredited by NAAC at 'A' grade during the III cycle in 2015. The college was established in 1984 by the visionary educationalist Vidya Seva Ratnam Shri.K.Santhanam, to provide Higher Education and Economic Independence to girls in particular from rural areas. The college has been making rapid progress in all spheres by the constant support and encouragement by Shri.S.Kunjithapatham, Secretary and Thotta.P.V.Ramanujam, President of the National College Council. Prof. Dr.K. Meena, Former Vice-Chancellor, Bharathidasan University, Trichy has been the backbone of the college and progressively encouraging the staff and students to achieve the Level of Excellence. The college aims to promote the economic independence of women through education.



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3. Terms of Agreement:

Shrimati Indira Gandhi College and SEVAI together agree to mutually support each other for the conduct of following types of activities.

- i. Integrated village community development.
- ii. Creation of awareness among women, especially illiterate / rural / socially & economically backward women, about
 - Keeping good health
 - Menstrual Hygiene Management
 - Sanitation and environmental preservation
- iii. Creating awareness on rainwater harvesting, use of renewable energy sources, eco-friendly practices and conservation of energy.
- iv. Conduct of short term training programs exclusively for women empowerment.
- v. Inclusive education and care for Differently Endowed children.
- vi. Providing skill based education & training to SHG group clusters and exploiting market potential for SHG products.
- vii. Taking ICT to backward areas, through skills training, awareness programmes and demonstrations. **(IT on wheels)**.
- viii. Motivating women and children to study and undergo vocational education to become employable.

Both the organizations have realized their responsibilities towards the progress of the nation and the upliftment of the citizens in general, women and children in particular. Hence they would like to compliment each other for the conduct of the above kind of activities.

4. Financial Provisions:

Both organizations would strive to provide all manpower and infrastructure and amenities free of cost for the cause of society. No financial commitments are made. Shrimati Indira Gandhi College would extend the support of its students and faculty members, for the conduct of the Programmes. Instructional material, pamphlets and brochures will also be prepared by them. On the other hand SEVAI would help in reaching the people, the beneficiaries of the operations, provide the venue for the conduct of the activities. The provisions extended by each party will be agreed upon a case by case basis.



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5. Co-Ordinators:

Shrimati Indira Gandhi College will be represented by a faculty member, who will be nominated as the Co-Ordinator, for the conduct of each programme. SEVAI will be represented by its Director, Shri. K. Govindaraju for co-ordinating the programme.

6. Renewal:

The MOU shall be renewed by the authorized representative of both parties, under mutually agreed terms and conditions through renewal applications.

7. Amendment:

The MoU may be amended upon the mutual consent of the two parties, as and when required.

8. Termination:

This MoU may be terminated by SEVAI or SIGC upon providing a written notice of three months. The expiry or termination of this MoU shall have no impact on any other specific agreement in force, which shall continue up to its normal expiry.

9. Arbitrations:

This MoU shall be subject to exclusive jurisdiction of courts in the location of Shrimati Indira Gandhi College and SEVAI.
