

Minutes of the meeting held on 20th December 2019

Topic I: An analysis of student's feedback about curriculum and performance of faculty in teaching, learning and assessment in the class, was presented by the IQAC Coordinator Ms.N.Vijayalakshmi. A report on the consolidated feedback of all the staff members, department wise, and course wise was submitted to the academic staff committee and the management for further action.



Then, Ms.N.Vijayalakshmi also presented a feedback by students on other aspects of the college like lab facilities, library services, fine arts, club activities, extra-curricular activities and sports. It was found that students were more interested in education tours and industrial visits. They wanted to participate in extra-curricular activities and fine-arts even more. Otherwise all other factors were found to be satisfactory. Industrial visits help students to have entertainment and a change in environment, but at the same time, they will have first hand learning experience, social interaction, team spirit and will appreciate what they learn better.

Fine-arts and sports help them to gain a healthy life, free from stress. They help in improving concentration, and desire to learn after a change in activity and mood. So students should be given ample opportunities for activities outside the class room.

Resolution: It was resolved to arrange for educational tours, industrial and field visits for all students. More activities to engage students shall be conducted.

Topic II: The placement coordinator,Ms.T.Malathi then presented the placement report for 2019-20 and the proposed placement drives to be convened this year. She requested all staff members to support the placement cell by motivating the students to participate in the training sessions and placement drives.



Minutes of the meeting held on 19th March 2020


Topic I: Alumni interaction was strengthened through various activities conducted throughout the year under the guidance of the IQAC. Each department of the college invited alumni students who are well placed in reputed institutions to address the present students regarding Entrepreneurship, Career placements and current trends in their respective domains. This created a good motivation for the present students and also a good rapport between the alumni and the students.

Topic II: Feedback on curriculum quality was obtained from the Alumni during the Alumni meets conducted during the course of the year by the IQAC. This was analyzed and reported to members of Boards of studies of the University from our college. Some feedback was also received from academic peers and employers to improve the curriculum. These were communicated to the Chairperson of the Board. Feedback on teaching was obtained from the students during the even semester.









Topic III: Students were given awareness about Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes during classes. The achievements of P.Os and C.Os were also measured by the respective class tutors and graphs for the same were submitted to the IQAC. Special meetings were conducted with staff regarding the Student Satisfaction Survey conducted by NAAC. The questions were also circulated among all staff members, so that they can focus on these parameters. A sample feedback based on the SSS was also collected among students and the results were found to be

satisfactory for most parameters. For those parameters that were not up to the mark, staff members were given instructions and guidance to improve the same.

Topic IV: Besides assigning tutors to take care of the academic performance of the students of a class, special mentors were assigned to each faculty member. Special days and time was fixed for mentoring activities to provide personal support to each student to overcome their shortcomings, obsessions and myths to improve their academic, and general performance and well being. Reports of the mentors were asked to be submitted to the Heads of Departments for further monitoring and action.

Topic V: Funds tapped from private organizations for research activities:

Even though application for tapping funds from government funding agencies like TNSCST, DBT, CSIR, ICMR, UGC etc. are done every year, we receive very little or almost no funds from them. Therefore the faculty members have applied to local organizations for funds for carrying out mini projects in their area of specialization. In response to the same funds to the tune of Rs. 7.75 lakhs were sanctioned by various agencies for carrying out projects and surveys. The details are given as under:
